THE SECOND EPISTLE GENERAL OF

PETER

CHAPTER 1

SIMON Peter, a servant and an apostle of Jesus Christ, to them that have obtained like precious faith with us through the righteousness of God and our Saviour Jesus Christ:

2 Grace and peace be multiplied unto you through the knowledge of God, and of Jesus our Lord.

3 According as his divine power hath given unto us all things that *pertain* unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of him that hath called us to glory and virtue:

4 Whereby are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises: that by these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world

diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowl-

6 And to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godl̃iness;

7 And to godliness brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness charity.

8 For if these things be(in)you, and abound, they make you that ye shall neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.

9 But he that lacketh these Mat.15:14 Rev.3:17 Eph.4:18 things is blind, and cannot see afar off, and hath forgotten that he was purged from his old sins.

10 Wherefore the rather, brethren, give diligence to make Eph.4:4 your calling and election sure: Col.3:12 for if ye do these things, ye shall never fall:

11 For so an entrance shall be ministered unto you abundantly into the everlasting kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Jesus

12 Wherefore I will not be negligent to put you always in remembrance of these things, though ye know *them*, and be established in the <u>present</u> Heb.1:12 truth.

13 Yea, I think it meet, as long as I am in this tabernacle, to stir you up by putting/you in physical body remembrance;

14 Knowing that shortly I must put off *this* my tabernacle, even as our Lord Jesus Christ hath shewed me.

15 Moreover I will endeavour that ye may be able after my decease to have these things always in remembrance.

16 For we have not followed cunningly devised fables, when 3952 (parousia):-presence we made known unto you the Rev.5:12 power and coming of our Lord 1Th.2:19 2Th.2:8 5 And beside this, giving all v.3 "power" Jesus Christ, but were eyewitnesses of his majesty.

(17) For he received from God Mat.3:16,17 the Father honour and glory, when there came such a voice to him from the excellent glory, This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased.

18 And this voice which came from heaven we heard, when Mat.17:5 Mar.9:7 we were with him in the holy

mount.

19 We have also a more sure Joh.1:1 word of prophecy; whereunto ye do well that ye take heed, as unto a light that shineth in a Joh.1:4,5 dark place, until the day dawn, and the day star arise in your 2Th.3:5 <u>hearts</u>:

20 Knowing this first, that no prophecy of the scripture is of any private interpretation.

21 For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost.

14 Wherefore, beloved, seeing that ye look for such things, be diligent that ye may be found of him in peace, without spot, and blameless.

15 And account that the longsuffering of our Lord is salvation; even as our beloved brother Paul also according to the wisdom given unto him hath 1Ki.3:12 of Isa.11:2 written unto you;

16 As also in all his epistles, speaking in them of these things; in which are some things hard to be understood, which they that are unlearned and unstable wrest, as they do also the other scriptures, unto their own (type)Psa.56:5 destruction.

17 Ye therefore, beloved, seeing ye know *these things* before, beware lest ye also, being <u>led</u> away with the error of the wicked, fall from your own stedfastness.
